Department of Justice of Canada	Section 253 of Criminal Code of Canada : « Operation while impaired »	Every one commits an offence who operates a motor vehicle or vessel or operates or assists in the operation of an aircraft or of railway equipment or has the care or control of a motor vehicle, vessel, aircraft or railway equipment, whether it is in motion or not, (a) while the person's ability to operate the vehicle, vessel, aircraft or railway equipment is impaired by alcohol or a drug; or (b) having consumed alcohol in such a quantity that the concentration in the person's blood exceeds eighty milligrams of alcohol in one hundred millilitres of blood.	Peace officer
Department of Justice of Canada	Section 175 of Criminal Code of Canada : « Causing disturbance, indecent exhibition, loitering, etc. »	Every one who (a) not being in a dwelling-house, causes a disturbance in or near a public place, (i) by fighting, screaming, shouting, swearing, singing or using insulting or obscene language, (ii) by being drunk, or (iii) by impeding or molesting other persons, (b) openly exposes or exhibits an indecent exhibition in a public place, (c) loiters in a public place and in any way obstructs persons who are in that place, or (d) disturbs the peace and quiet of the occupants of a dwelling-house by discharging firearms or by other disorderly conduct in a public place or who, not being an occupant of a dwelling-house comprised in a particular building or structure, disturbs the peace and quiet of the occupants of a dwelling-house comprised in the building or structure by discharging firearms or by other disorderly conduct in any part of a building or structure to which, at the time of such conduct, the occupants of two or more dwelling-houses comprised in the building or structure have access as of right or by invitation, express or implied, is guilty of an offence punishable on summary conviction. New Brunswick	71b paragraph and Article 72 of the Law on Land and Forest Crown	<p>The abandonment and disposal of waste on Crown land are prohibited. The waste is a violation which can be a violation under the provisions of this law and is considered an offense punishable by category C under Part II of the Act on the procedure applicable to POA . Such offenses carry a fine of \$ 172.50.</p> <p>71 No person shall</p> <p>(a)make an improvement on Crown Lands except with the consent of the Minister, or</p> <p>(b)dispose of, cause to be disposed of or permit the disposal of debris, refuse, garbage, residue from manufacturing or construction, bodies or parts of automobiles, other vehicles or machinery on Crown lands except in a dump or landfill provided for that purpose by the Crown, a municipality, a rural community or a lessee.</p> <p>72 A person who violates or fails to comply with section 71 commits an offence punishable under Part II of the <i>Provincial Offences Procedure Act</i> as a category C offence.</p>	Provincial conservation officers
Transport Canada	Canada shipping Act 2001 : small vessels regulation	<p>Part I – Licensing of vessels</p> <p>A pleasure craft equipped permanently or temporarily with a motor of 7.5 kW of power or more or with more than one motor, the aggregate power of which is 7.5 kW or more, must have a license unless the pleasure craft is registered.</p> <p>Part II – Minimum equipment requirements for pleasure craft</p> <p>Pleasure Craft over 8 m but not over 12 m in Length:</p> <p>16.04 (1) Subject to sections 16.2 and 16.3, every pleasure craft over 8 m but not over 12 m in length shall carry personal protection equipment, boat safety equipment, distress equipment and navigation equipment in accordance with subsections (2) to (5).</p>	Member of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, steamship inspector, member of any harbour or river police force, member of any provincial, county or municipal police force and any person designated as an enforcement officer for the purposes of these Regulations by the Minister of Fisheries and Oceans
Public Safety NB	Liquor control Act	136(1) Except as expressly provided by this Act or the regulations, no person shall consume liquor in any place other than a residence.	Peace officers
